Preface

The CJEU is the busiest court in the world, producing up to and sometimes more than 500 decisions in a single year. The student of EU law should be clear that they are about to enter a world of law that has its own legal instruments, law-making rules, principles and concepts and priorities. Yet this world is not totally unknown: EU law covers topics familiar from the first year of an undergraduate law degree, such as administrative law, institutional law and constitutional law. At the same time, EU law introduces learners to new areas of law that may be pursued in later years at undergraduate or postgraduate level, such as competition law, immigration law, trade law or equality and human rights law. Study of EU law therefore builds upon past learning while creating a base for future studies.

The study of EU law can be a challenge. These topics are often modules and degree programmes in their own right. Furthermore, European integration is an ongoing project thus change is continual and keeping abreast of the judicial decisions requires stamina and determination. In addition, misleading reports in the press can create confusion.¹ Despite these challenges, the material can be mastered. The purpose of this book is to help you to succeed in this, by encouraging reflection, debate and practical application alongside assimilation of new rules, concepts and principles.

The legal framework that has supported and sometimes led European integration is the focus of this book. The exploration will of necessity consider more than EU law: EU integration is both politics and economics:² economics and politics are both method and motivation. Law has been effective in perforating the boundaries of the nation state, making them permeable to create the internal market, yet has not fully erased them. All three – law, politics and economics – have played a role in the complex process by which the member states have partially opened up their markets and welfare systems. Member states have used European institutions to both promote and prevent over-intrusion of global forces (internationalisation and liberalisation)³ thus national differences persist, even if the challenges are common.⁴ Law has also in particular played a role where compromise and negotiation has failed or stalled.

My objective in writing this book was to present EU law in a way that is detailed and comprehensive, enjoyable to read and clear to understand. The story of the EU and EU law is full of controversy, conflict and change. However, we can only read about the lawmakers of the past – we live EU law: it is being made and remade in our lifetime. Whether it concerns family reunification or the sale of seal products, smoking or what

we eat, EU law affects how we live and what we do – as individuals and through our politicians – affects it. It is a topic that demands the attention of any aspiring lawyer, CEO or politician within the EU as well as beyond.

In order to remind the reader of the world within which EU law lives, each chapter begins with an opening ‘scenario’: this might be the details of a case, a quote from a newspaper or journal article or an extract from an EU legal instrument or official report. The purpose of this opening is to provide a context for the legal information that follows and a backdrop for the rules to be discussed. Throughout the chapter you will be invited to reflect upon the rules presented, often in light of this opening setting. These moments of reflection enable you to practise the application of EU law, to analyse it or – equally important – encourage you to develop an opinion. They also offer a possibility for discussion of a specific issue with your peers, either in class or in the cafe. Finally, they act as an intellectual hiatus, enabling you to ensure understanding of the material just read before moving onto the next section. In summary, the opening scenario acts as a factual background upon which to engage with EU law and the moments of reflection offer points for application, analysis and debate. By making EU law less abstract in this way, my hope is to make it more approachable and engaging. It may never become your favourite area of law, but I hope that you enjoy exploring it.

A quick word on terminology: you will note as you read through the text that both ‘European Community’ and ‘European Union’ are used. The word ‘Community’ appears where it is used in older case law and in some scholarly works. However this is a historic term and the current title is now ‘European Union’. Also, a word is necessary on the Union courts: when there was just one court it was called the ‘ECJ’ (European Court of Justice) – this name appears in some extracts. The current collective name for all three European Courts is the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU). Abbreviations such as CJ (Court of Justice), GC (General Court) or CST (Civil Service Tribunal) are used when referring to decisions of a specific court. Likewise, the pre-Lisbon Treaty numbering has only been used in extracts and citations, with the new Treaty numbering provided alongside.

With the CJEU producing so many decisions annually, writing a single-author tome covering the core constitutional, institutional and substantive aspects of EU law gets harder every year. If I have managed to do this at all successfully, it has only been due to the support of many people, especially my ever-patient editors at Pearson Press – Cheryl Cheasley, Holly Gardner, Owen Knight, Helen Leech, Roxanne Selby and Jennifer Sargunar: a big thanks to all of you for your care for this project. I am also grateful for the team of anonymous reviewers whose encouraging comments accompanied me as I wrote. My efficient editors–Jim Cauter and Linda Dhondy–added important final touches. Beyond the editorial team, I would like to thank my students for trusting me to teach them something worthwhile, as well as colleagues, collaborators and friends in academia, civil society and legal practice who have nurtured my passion for this topic – a special thank you goes to Professor Damian Chalmers, who many years ago inspired me to explore EU law. Finally, heartfelt thanks go to my family near and far, for inspiring me everyday with their faith, courage and love.

The history and development of the European Union

Setting the scene

In 2011, Greece, a long-term member of the European Union and the single European currency (the Eurozone) was on the verge of bankruptcy. After many long, heated and controversial debates at 'Euro-rescue-summits', the EU and the European Central Bank agreed a rescue plan to 'bail out' Greece. Under the plan, Greece was relieved of a debt in the region of 200 million euros but in turn would have to drastically cut public spending by removing jobs and public services as well as increasing taxes. On 1 November 2011 the Greek Prime Minister, Papandreou, announced that the bail-out plan would be put to a national referendum, allowing the Greek people to agree to the austerity measures to be imposed upon them. The EU leaders reacted with horror; under pressure from France and Germany, Papandreou cancelled the referendum on 4 November 2011. He subsequently resigned.
